JURISDICTIONAL NEWS



United States: Ban on chlorpyrifos in sight?

Capping 14 years of legal battles led by American associations, the Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit has enjoined the American Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to ban the use of chlorpyrifos, a particularly toxic insecticide. The court found that the EPA's delay in doing so has exposed a generation of American children to brain damage.



U.S.A.: Bayer's strategy for dealing with Roundup lawsuits

Bayer is paying a plaintiff to appeal a ruling in favor of the company in a lawsuit he filed over cancer he believes is linked to his use of the herbicide Roundup. Bayer's goal is to uphold the positive ruling at the federal level.

U.S.A.: Massive lawsuits against Syngenta and Chevron over Paraguat

Syngenta and Chevron are facing a growing number of lawsuits over the production and marketing of Paraquat, an old herbicide linked to Parkinson's disease. It is contained in the product marketed under the name Gramoxone.



Chile: Victory of the residents of Chaitén against the use of glyphosate for road maintenance

Thirty-three residents of the municipality of Chaitén, in the province of Palena in Chile, filed an appeal on March 25th, 2021 to the Court of Appeals of Puerto Montt. They noticed the use of glyphosate herbicides in the maintenance of municipal roads by the company Constructora San Felipe S.A.

France: The elaboration of departmental charters of commitments on pesticides is contrary to the Constitution

The Constitutional Council ruled that the procedure for drawing up departmental charters of commitments on pesticides was contrary to the Constitution. From now on, any person can participate in the elaboration of these charters, whether or not he or she is a resident of the area concerned.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS



Canada: The Quebec government recognizes the link between pesticides and Parkinson's disease

The Quebec government, led by François Legault, has included Parkinson's disease in the list of occupational diseases, thus recognizing for the first time the link between the use of pesticides and the onset of this disease.



U.K.: Neonicotinoids remain banned

The United Kingdom is reversing its decision of last January to authorize the use of the neonicotinoid insecticide thiamethoxam for sugar beet cultivation.

Glyphosate and glyphosate-based herbicides in courts


